The Constitution of India



Preamble

WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens:

JUSTICE, social, economic and political;

LIBERTY of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship;

EQUALITY of status and of opportunity; and to promote among them all

FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation; **IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY** this **26th day of November, 1949**, do **HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.**

Fundamental Duties

It shall be the duty of every citizen of India –

- (a) to abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem;
- (b) to cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom;
- (c) to uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India;
- (d) to defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so;
- (e) to promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women;
- (f) to value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture;
- (g) to protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers and wild life, and to have compassion for living creatures;
- (h) to develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform;
- (i) to safeguard public property and to abjure violence;
- (j) to strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement.

 - Regular checking of the almanac for intimations regarding homework and other instructions.
 - Attending Parent Teacher meetings
- ▶ Inform the school in case of any change in address.
- ▶ Address all your correspondence to the Principal. Correspondence from school to you will invariably have the Principal's Signature.
- ▶ Note that partial attendance in school is not allowed under any circumstances.
- ▶ Ensure that your ward does not carry mobile phone to school / excursions / picnics etc. The same if found will be confiscated by the school authorities and disciplinary action will be initiated.
- ▶ Send your child in school uniform even on his/her birthday.
- ▶ Parents are requested to avoid any kind of criticism of school and the teachers, in the presence of the ward as it may lead to loss of respect for the school/teachers, which may in turn lead to failure to learn from him/her, resulting in the lack of the child's progress.
- ▶ The Report Card being an important document should be kept carefully. In case it is spoilt or lost the concerned student shall pay Rs. 100 in order to get a duplicate Report Card (on written request).
- ▶ Ensure that the child is carrying water bottle, tiffin boxes and stationery items. Depositing any of the above items later at the reception will not be allowed.

RULES CONCERNING ABSENCE & WITHDRAWAL

1. No leave of absence is granted except on prior written application from parents or guardians and for plausible reasons only.
2. Every absence (due to sickness or otherwise) must be entered briefly on the Non - Attendance Leave Record page of the almanac and signed by parents or guardians.
3. Any absence of a student for more than ten days without intimation amounts to deletion of name from rolls. The student will then have to seek readmission depending on availability of seats.
4. A student returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease should produce a doctor's certificate, permitting him/ her to attend school. Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to class.
 - a. Chicken Pox - Till complete falling of scabs.
 - b. Measles - Two weeks after the rash disappears
 - c. Mumps - Until the swelling has gone ; about one month
 - d. Whooping Cough - Six weeks.
 - e. Conjunctivitis - One week (Till infection subsides)
5. As per the CBSE rules. students of the Senior Secondary are expected to have at least 80% attendance in order to be promoted.

WITHDRAWALS

1. One clear calendar month's notice in writing or a month's fee in lieu of such notice must be given before a pupil can be withdrawn.
2. For withdrawals, parents must ensure that the Transfer Certificate must be taken within three months time from the date of the request withdrawal. Caution money will be transferred through NEFT in parent's account. The cancelled cheque is to be given at the time of withdrawal. In case of a lapse on the parent's part, to claim the above-mentioned within the stipulated time of three months, it becomes mandatory for the parents to pay the Quarterly tuition fees for their ward (s) at the time of receiving the documents.

3. **Students can be asked to leave the school on disciplinary grounds or the following :**

- a) Unsatisfactory progress in work.
- b) Detention or repeated detention in class. As a rule only those students will be retained on the rolls of the school who can take the school leaving examination and are under 18 years of age.

4. Transfer certificates are not issued until all dues of the school are settled.

5. Those who leave the school in May must in all cases pay the fees for the month of June.

6. Once a Transfer Certificate is applied for, no holding of the transfer certificate is permitted.

SCHOOL FEE

The School fee is to be paid for all classes as per the circular to be put on the school website.

- Late fee charges : Rs. 10/- per day after the due date .
- Cheque Dishonour Charges : 400/-
- On Dishonour of Cheques, Parents should submit a fresh cheque

including :

i) Cheque return fine of `400/- and

ii) Late fee charge applicable

- Fees will accepted by CTS-2010 local cheque / D.D. only having the child's name, class, section, telephone # mentioned on the reverse side of the cheque / D.D.
- Cheque should be in the favour of Delhi Public School
- Parents should give separate cheque for each child in case of more than one child studying in the school. Post dated cheques will not be accepted.


NON-PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEE

Admission of a student automatically stands cancelled if the school fee is not paid within fifteen days after the due date.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

FOUNDATIONAL WING (NURSERY – II)

- P.Ed uniform for classes Nursery –Sr Kg to be worn every Wednesday with regular black leather Velcro shoes.
- For classes I & II house T-shirt to be worn every Tuesday with white canvas/sports shoes.
- Students of classes I & II have to wear the house T-shirt according to the houses allotted to them.
- Boys must wear vests (white only) and boxers. Their shorts should not be too tight.
- Girls must wear white slips and cycling shorts/Bloomers.

- P.Ed uniform for classes I & II to be worn according to the P.Ed period with black shoes.

- Black sandals are permitted only during rainy season.
- Green hoodie with school logo to be worn during winters.
- Bottle green turban for Sikh boys.
- Girls should tie their hair properly and long hair should be plaited or braided neatly with green ribbons/ rubber band.

- Half sleeves white shirt with School Logo
- White shorts (not more than 2" above knee) for classes III to VII
- White full pants for classes VIII & above
- Bottle green turban for Sikh Boys
- White socks with bottle green stripes

- White canvas shoes and House colour T-shirts on Tuesdays

- During winter, plain bottle green V-neck jersey, (sleeves optional) to be worn by boys and girls.
- Parents are expected to ensure that their wards are in proper uniform when coming to school.
- No shoes of any other colour or kind, chappals or other forms of high heeled shoes are permissible in school.
- As long as a student is on the School Rolls, he/she must come to school in proper school uniform.
- No gold jewellery or trinkets are allowed to be worn in school.
- Girls should tie their hair properly and long hair should be plaited or braided neatly with green ribbons.
- Boys should have their hair cut one inch above their ears. No fashionable hair-cuts are permitted.
- Girls are not permitted to apply mehndi or nail-polish or any kind of kohl (Kajal) on school days.
- Mobiles, cameras or iPads are not to be carried to school under any pretext.



EVALUATION SYSTEM

CLASSES IX-XII

As per the CBSE rules, a periodic evaluation system will be followed wherein the child is assessed throughout the year academically along with his/ her participation in co-curricular activities to bring an all-round development of the child. It is mandatory for every student to appear for assessments as per the schedule. Students will also be assessed on notebook submission and subject enrichment activities. Assessment also includes projects, assignments, class activities, creative writing, reading, listening and speaking skills. It is mandatory to take part in the above-mentioned activities.

Rules for Examinations

- Attendance is compulsory for all tests and examinations held during the year, failing which the student will be awarded zero. No consideration will be given to the absentees except on medical grounds, at the sole discretion of the Head of the school, after the parents personally meet and submit an application with the photocopies of all relevant medical documents on the day of examination at school office during working hours. It is the responsibility of both students and their parents to ensure that they do not miss any Written Tests or Examinations.
- Subjects like Marathi (Class-X), Physical Education, Art, and Music will also be graded.
- Students reporting late for examinations will not be given any extra time for answering the question papers.
- Unfair Means: Strict action will be taken in case a student is found using any unfair means during any of the examinations. Parents and the concerned student will be called and asked to provide an explanation. A repeat of such cheating in future will result in prompt issue of a Transfer Certificate without notice.
- Requests for the issue of Progress Cards before the declaration of results will not be entertained.

Promotion Criteria

Class IX: For promotion to the next higher class, it is mandatory for the student to appear for all the formal assessments, score at least 33% marks (in theory) in all examinable subjects and in aggregate, and have an optimal level of mandatory attendance as stated by CBSE.

Class X: As per the CBSE Promotion Policy.

Class XI: For promotion to the next higher class, it is mandatory for the student to appear for all the formal assessments, score at least 33% marks in all examinable subjects in Annual Examination as well as in aggregate, separately in both Theory and Practical assessments, and have an optimal level of mandatory attendance as stated by CBSE.

Class XII: As per the CBSE Promotion Policy.

- The evaluation for IX is divided into Pre-Mid Term Examination, Mid Term Examination , Post Mid Term Examination & Annual Examination.
- The evaluation for X is divided into Weekly Test-I , Periodic Test-I, Half Yearly Examination, Periodic Test-II, Pre-Board Examination-I & II.
- The evaluation of XI is divided into Weekly test-I & II, Half Yearly examination and Annual Examination.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT FACILITY

To facilitate easy movement of students to and from school, the school acts “only” as a coordinator between the parents and the Bus Contractors. It covers areas of Navi Mumbai - Koperkhairne, Vashi, Sanpada, Juhinagar, Nerul, Ulwe C.B.D. Kharghar and Chembur (Mumbai). Bus facility is optional and will be available to the wards of only those parents who furnish the undertaking as prescribed by the school and available with the school transport incharge.

- Students can avail the school transport arrangement subject to the availability of seats. The school does not entertain any request for change in bus route to suit an individual's convenience. A request to change bus stop for a day or a week is not entertained. As a rule, such requests should not be made. In case of emergency, parents should take their child personally from the school, after seeking the permission of the Principal.
- For students whose address / stop is changed, they need to fill up a bus cancellation/availing form (attached at the end of the almanac), pay up the required fees, and attach with it an application addressed to the Principal.
- Parents are not allowed to travel in the bus under any circumstances. Parents are requested to see that the children are escorted to and from the bus. If an escort, other than the parent comes to pick up the student; he or she should carry the I-card provided by the school, bearing the photographs of their parents and the student. Escorts should be at the bus stop ten minutes before the expected arrival of the bus.
- Students are not permitted to travel by any other bus except the one allotted to them. The students are expected to reach their bus stop 10 minutes before the arrival time of the bus. Each student is expected to board or get down from the school bus only at his/her regular stop, not just anywhere as per his/her convenience.
- Students who come on their own should reach school by 7.30 a.m.
- All students are required to wear the RFID Card daily.
- In case, the RFID card of a student is lost, the matter should be reported to the class teacher immediately. A fresh RFID card will be given to the student at an extra cost.
- Bus facility can be withdrawn if the bus contractor does not comply with the safety guidelines laid down by the Supreme Court of India.
- A student has to avail the bus service for the entire year. In case a student wishes to discontinue, the bus fee will have to be paid for the entire session.
